Note that the figures for all states are based on small sample sizes – for example South Australia is based on around 110 interviews (margin of error of +/-9%), Western Australia is based on around 130 interviews each (margin of error of +/- 9%), Queensland is based on around 250 interviews (margin +/- 6%), Victoria is based on around 330 interviews (margin +/- 5.4%) and NSW on around 430 interviews (margin +/- 4.7%).
